Tera te Direct Aid Program?

Te Direct Aid Program (DAP) bon te mwane ni buoka ae tararuaaki iaan te Australian High Commission iaon Kiribati. Te kantaninga n te buoka aei, bwa e na boutokai karikirake ake a katurui aia waaki ni boutoka te rikirake ao ni barongaki n te aro bwa e na boo n te buoka te botaki (*community*) ae bwanin. Ti kaungai karikirake man botaki aika uarereke, man taabo ake I tinanikun South Tarawa ma Betio, te reirei, uarokoia mwane ao aine nakon te rikirake ae ti te tikina, tararuan te mauri ao buokaia ake iai toaraia, waaki n takakaro, te rororrikirake, inanomatan te aomata, tararuan te otabwanin, kaungaakin karikirakean te konabwai ibukin te reita ni maeu, te ununiki ao ibuobuoki nakoia koraki ake a rootaki ni kanganga aika a karina ni korakoran bibilitakin kanoan bong. Te buoka ae te DAP e kona n anga \$20,000 mai eta ibukin teuana te karikirake.

Tera karikirake aika a kona ni mwanenaki iroun Aotiteria?:

- Karikirake ake a taketen bwaai aika a kona n riingaki ao n nooraki, ao ni korakora ana ibuobuoki nakon te rikirake.
- Aika baiti karaoaia, a kai nooraki mwilia n te tai ae waekoa, ao n ibuobuoki nakon karikirakean te konabwai iaon te waaki n tobwa ma boutokaan inaomataia aomata
- Karikirake ake e bon tauraoi te botaki ke te rabwata n anga naba ana ibuobuoki nako iai n aanga aika a kakokoro n aron karaaoan te mwakuri n aki kaboaki, kabonganaan bwaai ni mwakuri, karekean te bao ao te mwane
- Waaki n takakaro
- Boutoka nakon reirei ke kataneiai ake a irekereke ma katamaroan iokinibwai iaon katei aika kakaokoro, ma te kona n reitaki imarenan temanna ma temanna
- Karikirake aika a kai koro nanoia ao n teimaan korakoran aia ibuobuoki

- Te mwamwananga nako tinaniku
- Mwanenakin runga n takakaro ma kaotan katei, aika aki raoi matata bwa tera aia boutoka nakon te rikirake.

- Kabanemwane aika okioki, kabanemwane ibukin kabutan te aobiti, kabooan auti ke aobiti aika tangoaki, kaboan onobwai, ao karaaoan te uruaki

The Australian High Commission's Direct Aid Program (DAP) is now open for applications.

What is the Direct Aid Program?

The Direct Aid Program (DAP) is a small grants program administered by the Australian High Commission in Kiribati. The program aims to support projects with a strong development focus which are designed to benefit the whole community. We encourage projects in the areas of community and/or rural development, education, gender equality, health and disability, sport, youth, human rights, the environment, economic empowerment, agriculture and ad hoc humanitarian relief. The DAP grant can give a maximum of \$20,000 for each project.



What sorts of projects does Australia fund?

- Projects that aim at achieving practical and tangible outcomes of high development impact.
- Projects that have a direct, practical and immediate impact, including capacity building programs in areas of governance and human rights engagement.
- Projects where applicants and their communities make a contribution in labour, materials, transport or cash.
- Sporting activities.
- Projects that enhance educational and cultural exchanges and people to people links.
- Projects that are achievable and have sustainable outcomes.

What projects that are not eligible for DAP support?

- Projects that give grants or micro-credit schemes or projects that involve the return of money, or commercial ventures.
- Purchase of major assets, for example cars and boats.
- Australian or overseas study tours.
- International travel.
- Sponsorship of major sporting tournaments or cultural displays that do not have a clear developmental benefit.
- Staff salaries.
- Routine, recurring running costs and administrative expenses including office rental and utility costs, spare parts, routine maintenance.



Who is eligible for DAP support?

- Small groups, Church Communities, Villages
- Non-Government Organisations, Island Councils, Churches

The deadline for applications is 5pm Friday 17 January 2025.
